Second Sunday of Easter

SO THAT YOU MAY BELIEVE

It is not often that the author of one of the books of the Bible comes right out and tells us directly why he is writing what he is writing. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, taken from the conclusion of John's Gospel, the author tells us that he has chosen to record these events so "that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name" (20:31).

The letter of John echoes this idea by saying that "[e]veryone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God" (5:1)—what we might refer to as being "born again." Our reading from the Acts of the Apostles for this Second Sunday of Easter shows us exactly what it looks like when believers are born again through faith.

domingo, que pertenece a la conclusión del Evangelio según san Juan, el autor nos dice que ha elegido escribir estos acontecimientos para que "crean que Jesús es el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios, y para que, creyendo, tengan vida en su Nombre" (20:31).

La carta de san Juan retoma esta idea diciendo que: "todo el que cree que Jesús es el Cristo ha nacido de Dios" (5:1); lo que llamaríamos "nacer de nuevo".

Nuestra lectura de los Hechos de

los Apóstoles para este Segundo Domingo de Pascua nos muestra exactamente qué sucede cuando los creyentes nacen de nuevo por medio de la fe.

Second Sunday of Easter

Our readings this week give us a glimpse of how the first communities of Christians began to understand their purpose and identity. When Jesus appeared to his disciples, he said, "Peace be with you," calling his followers to bring his peace and forgiveness to God's beloved world. The early Church realized it was not a group of individuals each seeking to live virtuously and then go to heaven. Instead, Christians formed communities, empowered by the Spirit, attempting to live in profound trust in God and in each other. Remembering how Jesus displayed his wounds to his disciples, the church came to realize that it is called to share in the life of a wounded world. When we, the Church today, demonstrate our faith and love in action, we also show everyone who the crucified Jesus really is—the One who knows and accompanies us in our human suffering.

THE WOUNDS OF JESUS

In the Gospel passage from John, Jesus appears twice to his disciples, and both times Jesus shows them his wounds from his crucifixion. Thomas actually touches the wounds. Jesus' wounds did not disappear after the Resurrection. Jesus meant for his followers to know that his sufferings, and ours, are part of our encounter with him. Jesus revealed how God is present in our human suffering, joining us in our most painful moments with consolation and with mercy.

Suffering is a great mystery, and we cannot adequately explain or justify the many wounds we experience in life. However, in prayer God can open a way forward. The Holy Spirit might offer wisdom to perceive when or how our sufferings make healing or hope possible for others or for ourselves. When we enter into this mystery we follow Jesus, who radically trusted God to transform his sufferings into new life.

EMBODYING FORGIVENESS

In just a few verses, we see that the disciples received not only a new perspective on suffering, but a new energy and a new task in their lives. Their new energy, Jesus' very breath, is the Holy Spirit. Their new task, given in the same breath, is to embody God's forgiveness and proclaim this forgiveness to all. When Jesus appeared to them, he didn't castigate them for their abandonment and betrayal of him just days before. Jesus gave them the peace of being forgiven. He gave the Holy Spirit, so to forgive others.

The experience of being forgiven and forgiving others is at the heart of the Gospel. Jesus came to proclaim and to manifest God's desire to reconcile with God's very sons and daughters, us human beings. God is always working toward reconciliation and rejoices when any broken relationship is healed. When we accept forgiveness from God or from others, we are letting God into our hearts. When we forgive others or ourselves, we are participating in God's work.

Welcome Fr. Giopre Prado!

Fr. Giopre's second round at St. Anthony brings again his gifts in teaching and liturgy, Prado has a good singing voice. As a cantor at the University of Santo Thomas Central Seminary, he was a soloist for its 75th jubilee Mass and for its commemorative video. His musical tastes range beyond the liturgical, however. "Filipinos do love singing, and in my pastime I do karaoke singing with my friends," he said. Born the third of seven children in the town of Kalibo in the Aklan province, Prado credits his mother for being the first to lead him to consider the priesthood. His family and friends along the way also have provided support and encouragement in his discernment process. One of his brothers, George, is an assistant pastor in Kalibo. He finds inspiration both in St. Thomas Aquinas, the eminent 13th-century father of scholasticism, and in Blessed Teresa of Calcutta for her model of simplicity in serving others.

First Annual "Back Packs for Kids" Drive

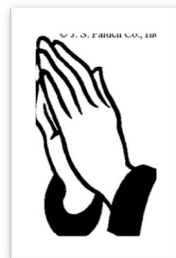

Segundo Domingo de Pascua

LAS LLAGAS DE JESÚS

En el Evangelio de Juan, Jesús se aparece dos veces a sus discípulos, y en esas apariciones Jesús les muestra las llagas de su crucifixión. De hecho, Tomás las toca. Las llagas de Jesús no desaparecieron después de su resurrección. Con eso, Jesús quiere que sus seguidores sepan que su sufrimiento, y los nuestros, sean parte de nuestro encuentro con él. Jesús reveló cómo Dios está presente en nuestro sufrimiento, uniéndose en nuestros momentos más dolorosos con consuelo y misericordia.

El sufrimiento es un gran misterio y no podemos explicar o justificar adecuadamente las muchas llagas que experimentamos a lo largo de la vida. Sin embargo, en la oración Dios puede abrir un camino por delante. El Espíritu Santo puede ofrecer sabiduría para percibir cuándo o cómo nuestros sufrimientos hacen posible la sanación o la esperanza para otros y para nosotros mismos. Cuando entramos en este misterio seguimos a Jesús, quien confió radicalmente en Dios para transformar sus sufrimientos a una nueva vida.

INCORPORANDO EL PERDÓN

En unos pocos versos, vemos que los discípulos no solamente recibieron una nueva perspectiva del sufrimiento, sino una nueva fuerza y una nueva tarea en sus vidas. Su nueva fuerza, el mismo aliento de Jesús, es el Espíritu Santo. Su nueva tarea, dada en el mismo aliento, es incorporar el perdón de Dios y proclamar ese perdón a todos. Cuando Jesús se les apareció, él no los castigó por haberlo abandonado o traicionado hacía solo unos días. Jesús les dio la paz de ser perdonados. Él dio el Espíritu Santo para que pudieran perdonar a los demás.

La experiencia de ser perdonado y perdonar a otros está en el corazón del Evangelio. Jesús vino a proclamar y a manifestar el deseo de Dios de reconciliarse con sus hijos e hijas, nosotros como personas. Dios está siempre trabajando hacia la reconciliación y se regocija cuando una relación rota es sanada. Cuando aceptamos el perdón de Dios y de los demás, así permitimos que Dios entre a nuestros corazones. Cuando perdonamos a otros o a nosotros mismos, participamos en el trabajo de Dios.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En tiempos pasados, cuando la Misa era en latín, no teníamos la oportunidad de escuchar en nuestra propia lengua las bellas palabras que Cristo pronunció durante la Última Cena y que el sacerdote repite durante la Consagración: “Esto es mi cuerpo”. . . “Esta es mi sangre”. Por tal razón los monaguillos sonaban unas campanitas indicando que algo importante estaba pasando. En ese momento los fieles levantábamos la cabeza para ver el pan convertido en cuerpo y el vino convertido en sangre. Lamentablemente el sacerdote nos daba la espalda y no podíamos ver lo que ocurría sobre el altar. Sin embargo, respondíamos con las palabras del apóstol Tomás: “Señor mío y Dios mío”.

Estas palabras reconocen y adoran la presencia de Jesús en el pan y el vino. A este momento se le consideraba el más importante de la Misa. No obstante, el Concilio Vaticano II vino a enseñarnos que este es el momento cumbre, junto con toda la Plegaria Eucarística, pues toda la Misa es igualmente importante, excepto que durante la Plegaria Eucarística alcanzamos el punto más alto de la celebración. Por esa razón ya no hay campanita, pues ahora escuchamos todo en nuestro propio idioma, así como los discípulos las escucharon de Cristo, en su propio idioma.
